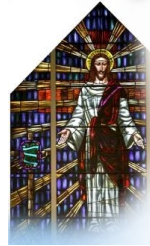

ANDREW’S LEGACY

We have the same call as Andrew on our lives. The scriptures do not tell much about Andrew, however each account is about him bringing someone to Christ. Andrew identified the young lad with the two fishes and five loaves and five thousand were fed. He spoke to Jesus of the Greeks desiring to meet with Jesus and it was Andrew with the exciting revelation said, “We have found the Messiah.” Andrew’s excitement mounted with each opportunity that came to introduce someone to his beloved Master. Andrew’s ministry and legacy is summed up in John 1:42 with these words, “And he brought them to Jesus.” Andrew didn’t write an epistle or found a church, but he was responsible for recruiting Peter and the scripture clearly define Peter’s contribution in establishing the Church of Jesus Christ.

Each day Andrew spent with Jesus was a stimulating experience and each encounter directed his understanding that there was so much more to embrace. Andrew’s legacy, from our personal experience, demonstrates that as we introduce others to Christ they too are changed. Simon became Peter the rock and was equipped for service. As we encounter Christ, like Andrew and Peter our instability will be transformed into a steadfast rock. The change we encounter and share with others is the assurance that no matter the turmoil surrounding us it cannot remove us from the love of Jesus. What a message we have received and are blessed to share. We may never write a best seller Christian book or preach to a stadium of people, but all of us are able to enrich the Kingdom of God by sharing, bringing others to be enriched with the life found in the community of faith in Christ. Being faithful to the unconditional and forgiving love of Christ will invite others to come and see and then stay. Confidence in the promises of our Master brings opportunities every day.
