A pious church member, who thought of himself to be a great Christian, stopped by a children's Sunday School class to say a few words asking, "Why do you think people call me a Christian?" NOTICE

Just this past week in youth we started a brief Lent study that invited us to "Notice" (lesson title) God more. It was on Matthew 6:1-18 where were lead to think about spiritual. The idea is that we do things of this nature to notice God more in our daily lives and we will hopefully refine our practices as Jesus has asked us to. There was one practice in particular that stood out to me, though: forgiving

We are well in to the season of Lent and it is worth asking if we are all willing to dive further in to the spiritual practice of forgiveness.

This is a practice we need to exercise more than ever. It could be the practice that rightfully replaces another practice we hold such as resentment, anger, or even pride.

I can look back in to many situations of my life where forgiving someone was incredibly hard for me to do. I sometimes feel like I am caving in or becoming weak to allow myself to forgive. It is the part that feels like it accomplishes something by being self-defined as morally right while someone else was morally wrong. It feels like not forgiving gives a false sense of power to openly exercise spite out of a place hurt or anger. The struggle is to see is the sinful nature we carry around to want to build ourselves up when we feel someone else has torn us down. We sometimes use our own pain as a pedestal to allow ourselves to use anger or hurt as motivational tool to act. These actions cannot line up with perfect grace, which we receive from Jesus and are called to exercise with others.

Jesus calls us to boast only in God. This call is given so that we may freely live in to the better life that He has called us to. This call requires us to put death to our self-righteousness, to put death to our anger, and to seek God's comfort in our pain.

As the old saying goes: "we become less so God can become more".

I would like to invite you to give up one more thing this Lenten season. Give up whatever is holding you back from forgiving. In return, replace it with a spiritual practice of grace and forgiveness. Allow God to become greater in your life and notice God more. Amen.
